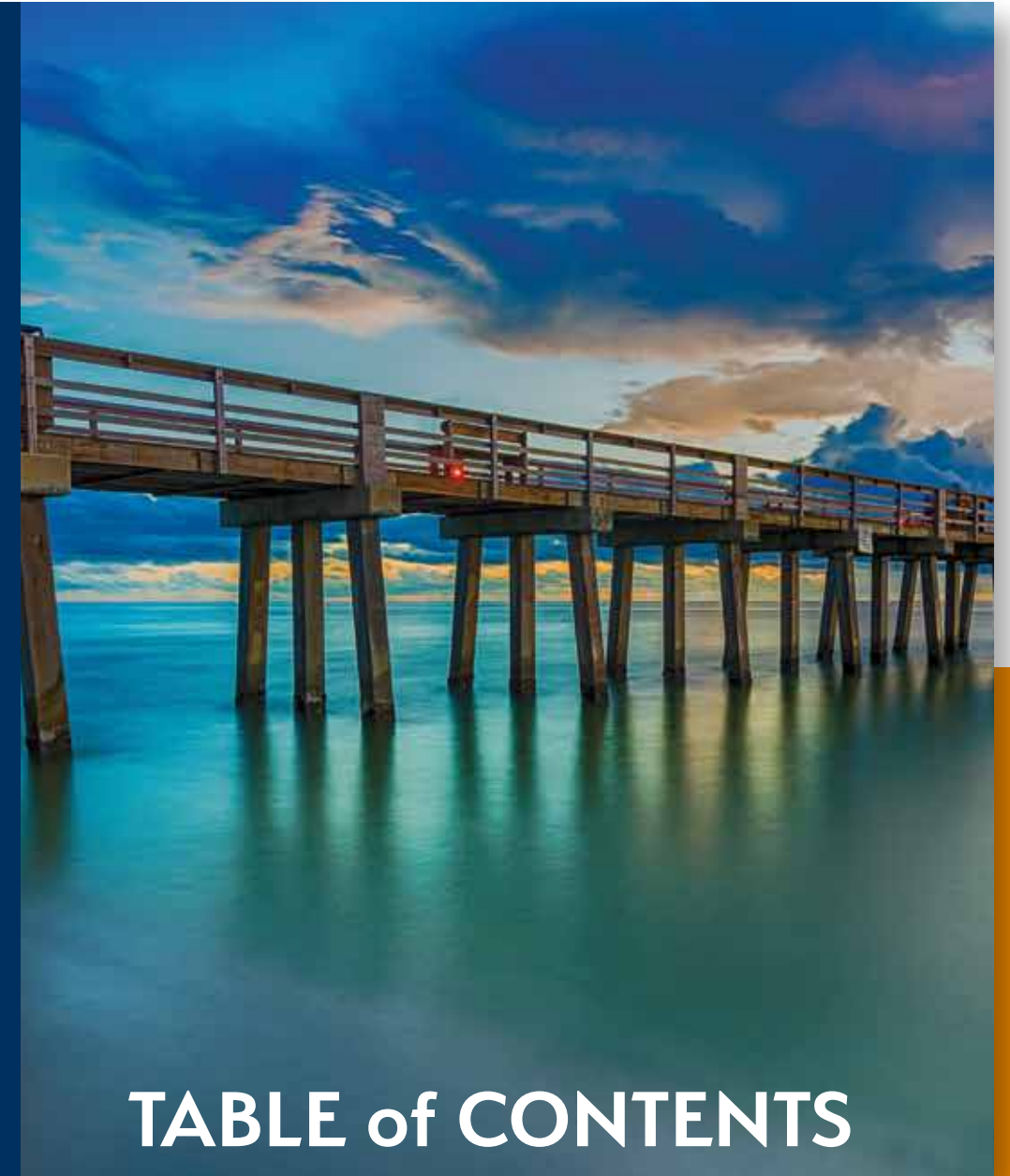

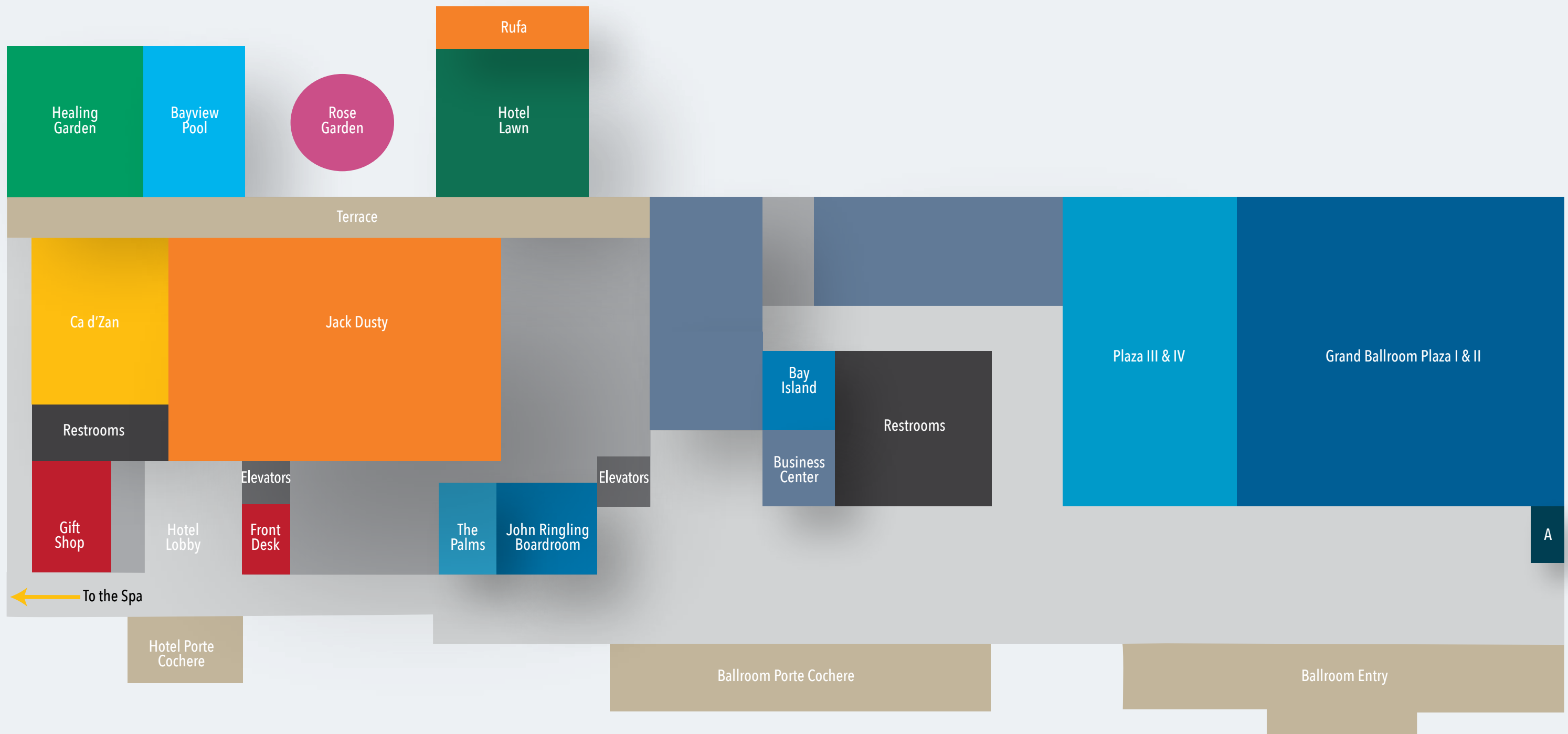

1 **Ensuring fair and transparent sports matches** amid concerns about betting on sports by involved parties and growing threats from match fixing and other forms of corruption in sport.

2 **Strengthening consumer confidence and appropriate consumer protections** amid growing threats from unregulated markets and rapidly expanding wagering options, including through harm-minimization measures.

3 **Addressing data privacy and data-sharing barriers affecting investigations, monitoring, and enforcement** to support more effective responses to integrity and related threats.

4 **Confronting athlete harassment as a growing threat to sport integrity** and identifying ways stakeholders can work together to reduce bettor-initiated aggression toward athletes and other involved parties.

As these issues continue to grow in complexity, visibility, and impact, the Coalition provides a strategic forum for cross-sector collaboration, helping align priorities, address structural barriers, and advance coordinated, actionable responses. The four issue areas outlined here represent the Coalition's initial focus, with expanded participation from other relevant stakeholders to be incorporated over time as determined appropriate by each topic working group's members.

IAGA's ability to lead initiatives like the Sport & Wagering Integrity Coalition is made possible by the ongoing support of its members and sponsors. 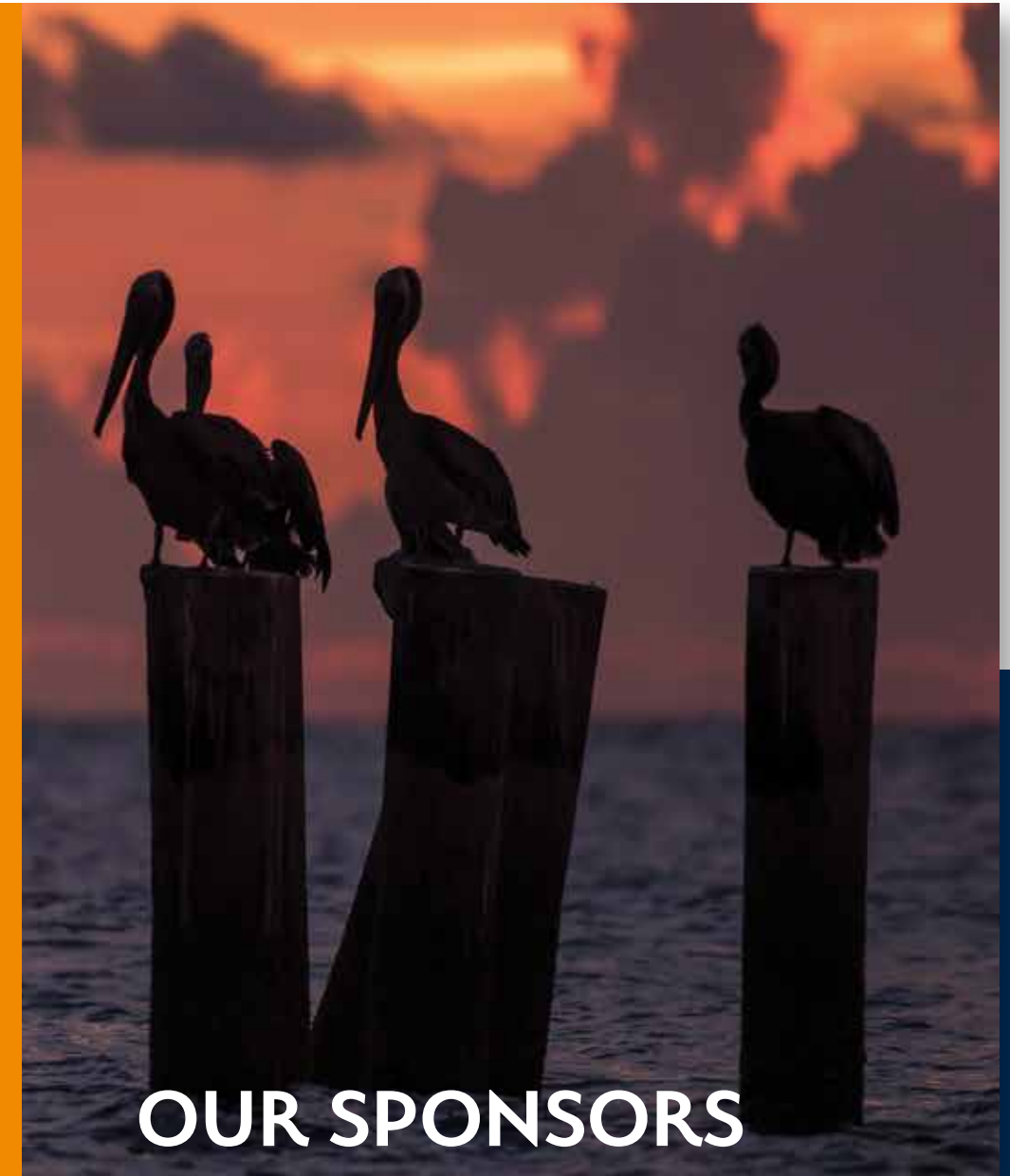

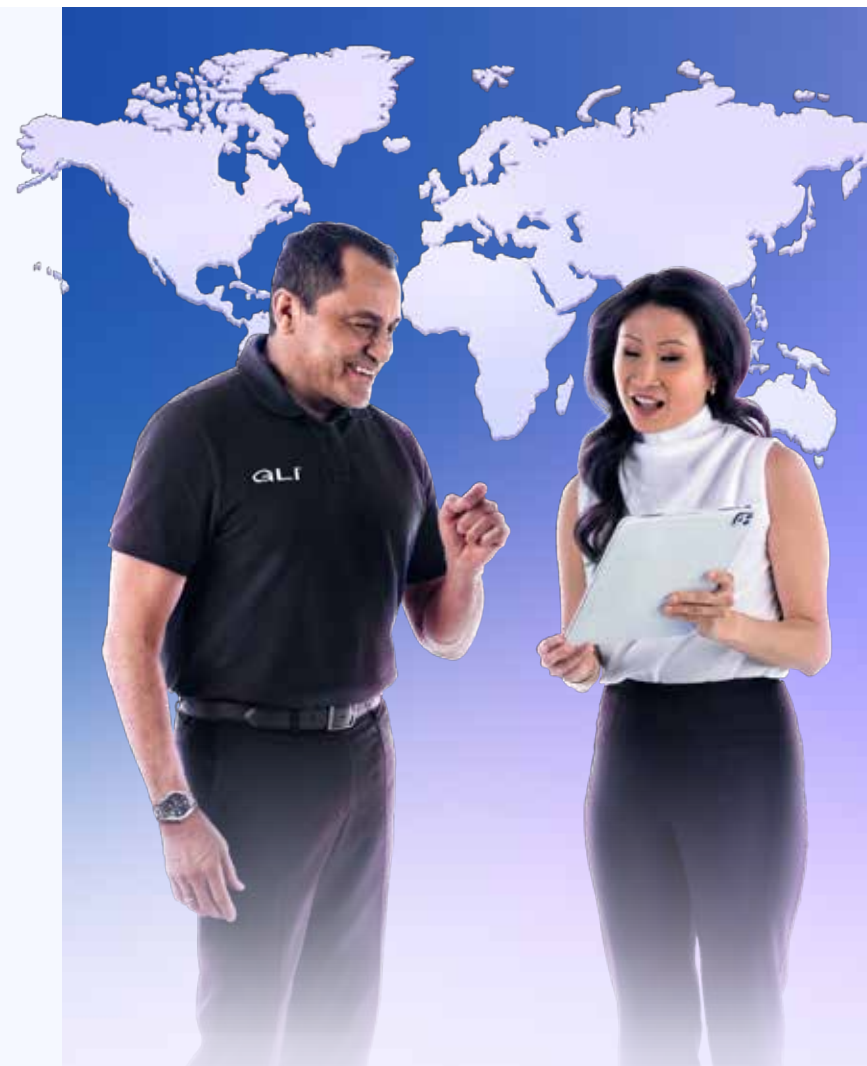

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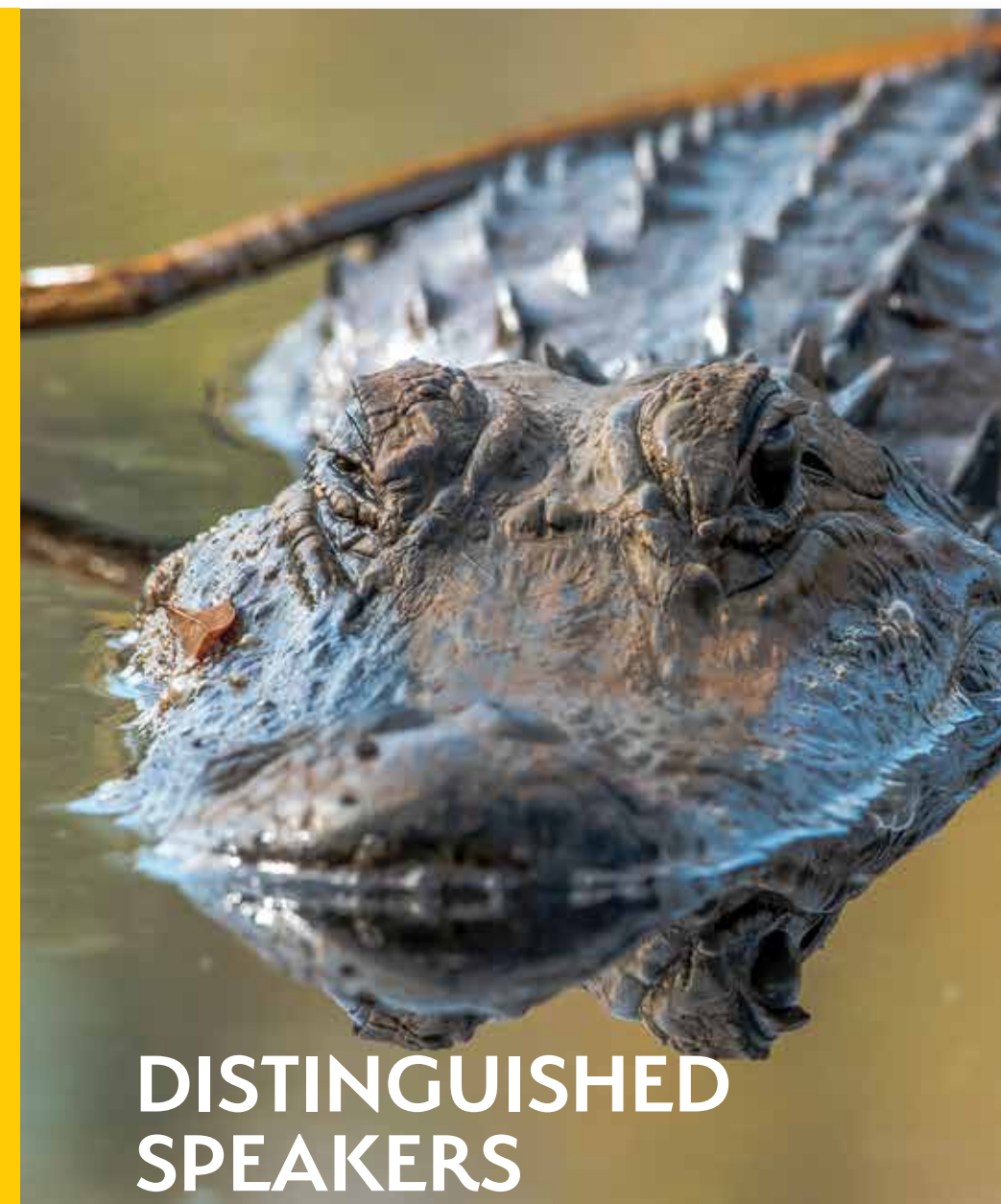
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JAMES ALLEN: KEYNOTE SPEAKER



James F. Allen is a gaming and hospitality industry veteran with nearly five decades of experience and currently serves as Chief Executive Officer of Seminole Gaming, Chairman of Hard Rock International and Hard Rock Digital, and previously served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the American Gaming Association, the gaming industry's premier trade group. Responsible for all gaming, hospitality, and entertainment operations for the Seminole Tribe of Florida since 2001, Allen has transformed Seminole Gaming into one of the world's most successful casino and integrated resort operators. Under his leadership, the enterprise has grown to include six casino locations throughout Florida, including the world's first Guitar Hotel—an industry-defining property concept created by Allen, who originated the guitar shaped design and led its development— which opened in October 2019, and has become a global landmark for the Hard Rock brand.

Allen led the Seminole Tribe of Florida's acquisition of Hard Rock International in 2007, marking the first acquisition of a major international company by a North American Indian Tribe. As Chairman, he oversees one of the most globally recognized brands, known for its unique intersection of music, entertainment, and philanthropy. Since the acquisition, Hard Rock has expanded its global presence from 46 to nearly 80 countries, with more than 300 locations including cafes, hotels, casinos, Rock Shops, and live music venues, employing approximately 60,000 team members worldwide.

Under Allen's leadership, Seminole Hard Rock and Hard Rock International have demonstrated exceptional hospitality, innovation, and financial performance. Seminole Gaming is the only gaming entertainment company to maintain investment grade ratings from Fitch and Standard & Poor's for 15 consecutive years. In 2021, Seminole Hard Rock became the first private gaming entertainment company designated a U.S. Best Managed Company by Deloitte Private and The Wall Street Journal, earning the distinction consecutively through 2025. Hard Rock International has also received multiple recognitions from Forbes, including America's Best Employers for Women and World's Best Employers, along with honors for Diversity, Social Impact, and as a Top Large Employer in Travel, Leisure, Gaming, and Entertainment. Hard Rock Hotels has consistently ranked among the top brands in J.D. Power's North America Guest Satisfaction Index Study.

Allen has led the continued evolution and diversification of the Hard Rock brand. In 2020, he launched Hard Rock Digital, a joint venture focused on online sports betting, retail sportsbook, and internet gaming. He also played a key role in advancing gaming innovation through a landmark compact between the Seminole Tribe of Florida and the State of Florida, positioning the Tribe as a leader in online sports betting. Allen further expanded Hard Rock's global footprint with the 2022 acquisition of The Mirage Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas, which is currently being redeveloped into a flagship Hard Rock destination. He has also driven the brand's expansion into global sports and entertainment through high-profile partnerships, including naming rights for Hard Rock Stadium, founding partnerships with Formula 1 Miami Grand Prix and Las Vegas, sponsorship of Oracle Red Bull Racing, and collaborations with global icons such as Lionel Messi and Dale Earnhardt Jr. He also serves on the Miami Host Committee Board of Directors for the FIFA World Cup 2026.

Beyond business performance, Allen supports philanthropic and cultural initiatives aligned with music and education, including his involvement with the Bruce Springsteen Archives & Center for American Music, which preserves and promotes the legacy and cultural impact of American music. He also serves on the board of the Hard Rock Heals Foundation®, the company's charitable arm, helping drive millions of dollars in support of health and wellness, sustainability, disaster relief, anti-human trafficking causes, children's charities, and music-based initiatives.

In addition to his operational leadership, Allen is widely recognized for his commitment to regulatory compliance, responsible growth, and competitive integrity within the gaming and hospitality industry. Through his leadership with the American Gaming Association and service on regulatory task forces, he has worked closely with policymakers and industry stakeholders to support transparent governance, adherence to antitrust laws, and the development of uniform commercial standards governing complex contractual and transactional environments. His background also includes formal training in gaming operations and hotel administration, further strengthening his expertise across both regulatory and operational disciplines.

Allen is a former member of the New Jersey Casino Control Commission Task Force on Gaming Regulation and currently serves on the Board of Directors of the American Gaming Association. He also serves on boards including the Rock and Roll Forever Foundation and the Seminole Hard Rock Winterfest Boat Parade. Allen is a frequent speaker on gaming and hospitality trends at major conferences, governmental programs, and academic institutions, and regularly appears on national and international financial news networks including CNN, CNBC, Bloomberg, and Fox Business. In recognition of his contributions to the industry, Allen was inducted into the American Gaming Association Gaming Hall of Fame Class of 2024 and received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the East Coast Gaming Congress in 2025. He has also been honored by the National Association of Minority Contractors as a Unity Gala Honoree and previously named a Business Hall of Fame Laureate by Junior Achievement of South Florida, as well as an inductee into Nova Southeastern University's H. Wayne Huizenga College of Business and Entrepreneurship Hall of Fame.

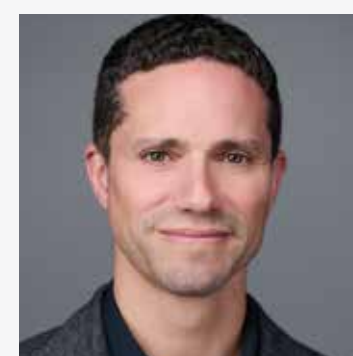
Rodney W. Phillippe

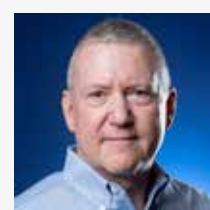

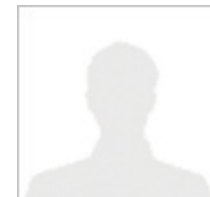
